On 02/02/18, at approximately 1603 hours, I responded to

in reference to assault with a deadly weapon call. While working patrol in the Rincon District, Beat 2 and 3, an assault with a deadly weapon occurred in Rincon District, Beat 1. I responded as backup to

which was the address the suspect, Hernando Enriquez, was reported to live.

Upon my arrival, I made contact with Sergeant D. P. Tyra #1329, the Rincon District supervisor. As I spoke with him, Captain J. O. Lopez #755 had advised that the subject, Hernando Enriquez, who was supposed to be transported via helicopter, was being transported by ground, due to an extended estimated time of arrival for the transport helicopter. I was advised the ambulance had already departed the area and I was requested to catch up to it and follow it to the hospital.

I was able to catch up to the Rincon Valley Fire Department ambulance at Campbell Avenue and Speedway Boulevard. I then followed the ambulance to the emergency bay where I followed medical personnel and the subject, Hernando, into the hospital where he was evaluated in Trauma Room 5. Detectives were on scene and standing by.

Detective personnel and I stood by while medical personnel evaluated Hernando's injuries. I overheard medical personnel state that Hernando had a punctured lung and that his throat was cut; however, they did not believe he had severed his carotid arteries. Once Hernando was prepped for surgery, medical personnel moved him from Trauma Room 5 to the operating room.

I stood by with detectives to secure evidence. Once evidence was secure, I was advised by detectives on scene that I was no longer needed and I departed the area.

NOTE: While Hernando was being evaluated by medical personnel, I was requested to remove Hernando's handcuffs, which I did with no incident.

This concludes my involvement.

NARRATIVE:

At approximately 1607 hours, on 02/02/18, I responded to the area of

The call text stated a male had come to the reportee's door and said his father was trying to hurt him. He was bleeding and looked to be approximately 18 years of age. The call text stated his father had hit him with a hammer and the father was at his house down the street. The victim was [REDACTED] The father told the son that he was trying to kill him because the father was depressed. I was then advised on the call text that his address was ***** as the original location of incident was changed from ***** I had learned that the Calle Agassiz address was where the young male had run to and his home was in fact *****

I then arrived on scene in the area of the Calle Agassiz address with Sergeant D. P. Tyra #1329, Deputy C. P. Campbell #8344 and Deputy B. S. Starr #8368 who were already on scene. I was advised by Sergeant Tyra that the four of us would attempt to make contact at the front door and, if immediate contact was not made, that forced entry would be made into the residence as it was believed that the mother and daughter were in the residence. It was unknown if they had already sustained any injuries or had already been possibly attacked.

Sergeant Tyra, Deputy Campbell, Deputy Starr and I then responded to the front door of ***** made at the front door with negative results. Forced entry was then made and the door was forced open. At which point, I then gave loud commands advising the Sheriff's Department and for anyone in the house to come out with their hands up.

At this time, looking into the home, I noticed what appeared to be small amounts of blood spatter on the floor noticing a cell phone by the doorway, as well as other disturbances on the floor to included what appeared to be crayons and possibly Christmas lights. I did not hear any sounds of movement. I also did not see anything or anyone moving inside the home.

Deputies then entered the home to which our firearms were utilized. As we were clearing the residence, we were able to locate what was later identified to be a bathroom. At which point, after I opened the door as other deputies were providing cover, another deputy advised that there were possibly two bodies located in the bathtub. At which point, I entered into the bathroom looking for a possible suspect or any threats inside the bathroom and noted there were none.

It appeared there were two females lying in the bathtub. One appeared to be a juvenile young adult which I noted to have what I identified as large cut mark to her neck. The other female was also non-responsive and I did not notice any obvious signs of any fatal injuries. At that point, I then entered into the next adjacent bedroom, as the rest of the house was clear, in an attempt to locate the suspect. At which point, the residence was then cleared with no other persons found inside the residence.

As other deputies and I were then clearing the exterior of the home to include various sheds and other small storage structures, one of the other deputies on scene was able to locate a male lying face down in a dirt culvert. At which point, all deputies responded to the scene. I noted what appeared to be a Hispanic male wearing a dark blue shirt and blue jeans. He appeared to have large amounts of blood on himself and his clothing. He was lying face down. At which point, other deputies and I were unable to see his hands as they appeared to be pulled completely under his body.

After a short period, another deputy on scene was able to place handcuffs on the subject as it was noted it appeared he was breathing due to his chest rising and falling. After handcuffs were placed on him, I overheard him stating: Please kill me, shoot me. He was saying this in a very calm and quiet manner speaking with a weak voice.

At that time, Corona de Tucson Fire Department (CTFD) had arrived on scene who were standing by outside of the residence as deputies had arrived on scene. The various fire staff who was on scene advised the male would need to be removed from the dirt culvert. At which point, I started taking photos of the placement of the male in the dirt culvert while paramedics were on scene.

I then assisted by removing the male from the dirt culvert onto a gurney that was standing by. I was able to hold onto the right side of his body using my left hand to hold his jean waistband and my right hand to secure and lift his right shoulder. Once he was brought to the gurney and placed on his side, he then was rolled over onto his back. At which point, I retrieved my camera again and was able to take photos of the suspect where it appeared that there was a

large amount of blood covering his face. I also noted a large open wound defect to the right side of his neck. There appeared to be knife slash marks on his chest. The front side of his body was also noted to be covered in blood.

As the subject was removed from the scene by CTFD for medical transport, I then was able to take photographs on scene to include the knife that was located underneath his person, as well as the pool of blood. A picture was taken of the T-shirt that had been removed by medical staff and I took a photo of where it was placed outside. I also took a photo of the taser cartridge that had been utilized while detaining the subject.

At which point, I then responded to Tomasita Drive itself as medical staff had removed the blue jeans that were on the subject. I then took photos of the blue jeans and placed them into a paper bag. When doing so, I noticed a wallet in his pocket which had an Arizona driver's license for Hernando Enriquez. Inside the wallet was noted to be no form of paper cash money. Also noted was a set of keys. The wallet, as well as the keys, were photographed separately and all items were placed into a bag where the chain of custody for the evidence was taken by detectives who arrived later on scene.

At this time, I stood by with detectives and, at approximately 2200 hours, I then left the scene with the directives of various detectives, as well as Sergeant Tyra, who were on scene. The film card was later placed into processing at the Rincon District Office.

This concludes my involvement in this incident.

On 02/02/18, I was dispatched to

in reference to an assault with a deadly weapon call. While en route, dispatch advised a male came to the reportee's door and said his dad was trying to hurt him. He was bleeding and appeared to be 18-years-old.

Dispatch then advised the victim stated his dad hit him with a hammer and his dad was currently at the house down the street. Dispatch then advised Corona de Tucson Fire Department (CTFD) would be holding off. Dispatch then stated the reportee stated the victim's name was [REDACTED] and the dad told the son he was trying to kill him because the dad was depressed. Dispatch then stated the reportee was transferred to CTFD for pre-arrival. They were informed he was hit in the head with a hammer. He had scrapes on his arms from possible knife wounds.

Dispatch then advised there was a [REDACTED] in the system showing an address of

The call taker could hear the victim saying hurry up in the background. Dispatch then stated [REDACTED] lived at

He had a hole in his head and the line disconnected so the reportee could get some towels.

Upon arrival, Deputy C. P. Campbell #8344 was already on scene speaking with the victim. I then made contact with the reportee who was identified with his Arizona driver's license as James Talbot. I asked James what happened today.

James informed me he was sleeping inside his residence when he heard a banging on the door. James then stated he went to open the door. When he did, he saw a Hispanic male yelling at him to let him in. James then walked him to the back

porch and had him sit down while he called 9-1-1.

While James was on the phone with 9-1-1, he stated the kid told him the dad hit him with something heavy; however, he could not remember exactly what it was. James then stated the kid also informed him the dad had a knife and there was a lot of blood in the residence. James then stated that while he was talking to the male he was going in and out of consciousness. The male informed James that he and his dad had gotten into a fight in the house and that was how he was able to get away.

After speaking with James, I then made contact with Deputy Campbell who was currently on the phone with Sergeant D. P. Tyra #1329. Deputy Campbell advised that Sergeant Tyra was on his way to the scene. While waiting for Sergeant Tyra, CTFD arrived on scene and assisted the victim who was later identified as [REDACTED]

While CTFD assisted his wounds, I grabbed my department-issued camera and took photographs of the visible wounds on him. There was a wound on his right forearm as well as his head was bleeding a lot. There was a lot of blood coming from his head. You could see dried blood down his pants as well as on his shoes and on his shirt. His face was covered in dried blood.

While the fire department attempted to load Hernando onto their gurney, he passed out. Once the fire department had him in the back of the ambulance, they then transported him to the hospital. At that point, Sergeant Tyra arrived on scene. Sergeant Tyra informed us we would be going to Hernando's address of *****

however, we were waiting for Deputy R. M. Taskila #7132.

Once Deputy Taskila arrived on scene, Sergeant Tyra, Deputy Campbell, Deputy Taskila and I then cleared the residence. Inside the residence there were multiple piles of blood all around as well as a hole in the wall leading into one of the bedrooms on the north side of the house. Once we got to the back of the house, we located two females in the bathtub who appeared to have severe wounds. Upon completion of clearing the house, I then checked for signs of life on both females; however, they were both deceased. Both females had severe lacerations to their neck and to their stomach. It appeared as if rigor mortis had set in.

After checking for signs of life, myself and Deputy Campbell then conducted a secondary search. Upon completion of the secondary search, no other people were located inside the house. At that point, Sergeant Tyra, Deputy Taskila, Deputy Campbell and I searched outside of the residence.

In the backyard, by a horse corral, we located another male who was believed to be a possible suspect. The male was lying facedown and had his arms tucked under him. Multiple commands were given; however, the male did not respond to any commands. At that point, Sergeant Tyra deployed his taser. Once the taser had been deployed, I then went and placed handcuffs on the male. After placing handcuffs on the male, I checked his waistband for any weapons, however none were found.

I then stood by with the male until the fire department arrived on scene. While standing by, the male made multiple statements such as "Please kill me", and "Kill me". While the male made those statements, my department-issued recorder was turned on. Once paramedics arrived on scene, I then stood by until they secured the male onto a gurney. Once they lifted the male up, a knife was located under his neck and chest area. I then stood by with the knife until I was properly relieved.

Once relieved, Sergeant Tyra asked me to start an entry and exit log at 1735 hours. My entry and exit log consisted of Badge #1339, Heath, who entered the crime scene at 2114 hours. Badge #7730, Petersen, who entered the crime scene at 2114 hours. Badge #1329, Sergeant Tyra, who entered the crime scene at 2028 hours and exited the crime scene at 2043 hours. Badge #1044, Sergeant Isely, who entered the crime scene at 2053 hours and exited the crime scene at 2113 hours. Badge #3541, Forensic Technician McGraw, who entered the crime scene at 2028 hours. Badge #1233, Detective Hogan, who entered the crime scene at 2028 hours and exited the crime scene at 2113 hours. Lieutenant S. R. Lowing #818, entered the crime scene at 2053 hours and exited the crime scene at 2105 hours. On 02/02/18 at approximately 1603 hours I responded to

The call text advised that a teenage male who was bleeding came to the reportee's door. The male stated that his father was trying to hurt him. I arrived at the location at approximately 1611 hours and was waved down by a Caucasian male who was later identified to me as James Talbot.

As I was driving up the property James directed me towards his back patio by using his hands and arms to point behind his residence. As I pulled around to the back of the residence I observed on the back patio a young Hispanic male sitting in a chair. I could see the left side of his face was dark red in color and he was holding the top of his head with his left hand and his hair appeared to be wet, as well as his face was wincing as if he were in pain.

I exited my vehicle and approached. As I walked up to where the male was seated I heard him say, "Please help me, my head really hurts, oh my god it hurts so bad." I walked up the patio steps and noted spots of blood on the male's jeans. He had lacerations on his right forearm and his face was covered half red from blood coming from the top of his head. While I was speaking to the male James was trying to assist him by placing a moist cloth on his head. [REDACTED] stated the weight of the moist cloth felt as if it were crushing his head so James removed it.

I asked the male what his name was and he verbally identified himself as [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]) I asked James if anyone else came with [REDACTED] and he told me that he was the only one who showed up at his residence. I advised Communications that it was clear and safe for medical personnel to make their way on scene.

I asked [REDACTED] to tell me what happened. [REDACTED] said he had just gotten out of school and his father called him asking him to come home, specifically telling him that he needed his help with something. [REDACTED] told me that he thought nothing of it because his father has always been a model father to him, never having any previous incidents of violence or anything else out of the ordinary, just a regular good father. [REDACTED] told me that when he got home his father met him outside at his vehicle and told him not to go inside. [REDACTED] asked him father where his mother and sister were and his father told him they were playing hide and seek. They then went to retrieve the mail from the mailbox

and [REDACTED] father told him that he needed to help him clean up inside the house.

They went inside and spoke briefly. [REDACTED] said his father then went to retrieve something, which he thought was going to be a cleaning supply. However, [REDACTED] father turned around and struck [REDACTED] in the head with a blunt instrument, being either a hammer or a car jack. [REDACTED] was not able to specify what the object was other than it being a blunt instrument. [REDACTED] said his father used an overhand swinging motion to strike him. [REDACTED] said he and his father then began to fight and struggle with each other, his father attempting to "bash my head in" striking him repeatedly in the head. I asked [REDACTED] where he struck him and he pointed to the top of his head which he had been holding the entire time. [REDACTED] told me that he kept yelling at his father, asking him what was happening and to calm down. He was able to push his father away from him briefly and his father used this moment to grab a knife.

They continued to struggle more and [REDACTED] father was able to get him into a headlock. [REDACTED] told me that he tried to keep the knife away from him by grabbing his father's arm and holding it outstretched away from his person. [REDACTED] told me that during their altercation the struggle went into a bathroom and there his father was trying to stab him. [REDACTED] told me that he was able to push his father away from him again and this time he used the opportunity to run away. He said he just ran down the road to his neighbor's house and banged on the door, yelling for them to call 911.

I noted that all throughout what [REDACTED] was telling me he was noticeably grimacing in pain, saying that his head hurt a lot and that he is surprised that he was alive right now. I asked [REDACTED] about his mother and sister and he told me that he had not seen them. He added to that by saying, "I just know they're dead, I know my dad killed them." [REDACTED] told me that while he was fighting his father that his father told him something to the effect of, "It's not worth it anymore. Let me take both of us away. I've already taken your mom and sister away."

I asked [REDACTED] where his father was now and he told me that he should be at home. I inquired as to where home was and he told me that he lived at

outside. [REDACTED] pointed his hand directly to the east saying it was down that road. I asked [REDACTED] what his father's name was and what he looked like. [REDACTED] told me that they have [REDACTED] and his father looks just like him only older. They have a similar build and the same straight black hair. I took note that [REDACTED] was approximately 5'06" to 5'07" tall, appearing thin, possibly weighing approximately 130 to 150 pounds with medium length straight

black hair.

Rincon Valley Fire Department (RVFD) arrived on scene, Run #0094, while I was speaking to [REDACTED]. They began to evaluate him and determined that due to the extent of his injuries he was going to be transported to Banner-University Medical Center South. I was later advised that he was transported to Banner-University Medical Center main campus. [REDACTED] was placed into the ambulance and shortly after left the residence. I observed that when medical personnel attempted to have [REDACTED] stand up and walk to the gurney he almost fainted. I saw both of his eyes roll back into his head and his legs go limp underneath him. The two medical personnel had to hold him underneath both his armpits to keep him from falling down. They then carried him to the gurney.

At this time Deputy B. S. Starr #8368 and I were the only units on scene and she had spoken to the reportee. Please see her report for further on her involvement. I then made telephonic contact with Sergeant D. P. Tyra #1329 and informed him of the information I was able to ascertain from Hernando prior to him being transported. From the front of James's residence, which was facing east, I was able to see approximately a quarter mile to the east a residence with a blue van and white Nissan truck. I stood by at the Calle Agassiz address observing the residence until Sergeant Tyra and Deputy R. M. Taskila #7132 arrived on scene. I noticed no persons nor vehicles coming from the residence or the road.

Shortly after I went with the other deputies on scene to

Where the blue Dodge van and white Nissan truck were parked on the south side of the property. I noted the blue van was a Dodge Caravan and the white truck was a Nissan Frontier. I then deployed my department issued rifle and chambered a round into it. We approached the residence and I provided security at the front windows while announcements and then entry was made into the residence. I noted that no answer was given to the very loud announcements given by Sergeant Tyra. I then assisted in clearing the residence.

Upon making my way through the front door I noted I was stepping into a living room. Inside the living room I saw multiple very small objects scattered on the ground as well as various spots of dried blood on both the wall and ground. They varied in size from approximately one inch in diameter up to ten inches in diameter. There was an adjacent living space to the southwest of the living room where I saw more red, circular stains on the floor. After clearing that living space I held cover on an adjacent bathroom while Deputy Taskila opened the door.

Open the door being opened I could see in the bathroom there was more blood on the floor and in the tub I could see a pair of human legs sticking out of it. I then assisted in clearing an adjacent bedroom to the bathroom.

After doing so I began to conduct a secondary search of the residence. During the secondary search I checked the bathroom where I saw the legs sticking out of the bathtub. I observed there were two females in the bathtub, both having deep lacerations on the front of their necks and stomachs. The wounds appeared to already be dried and upon checking for a pulse I noted that rigor had set in. I observed in the previous adjacent living area that there was what looked like a family photograph of four people on the wall. In the photograph I saw a young Hispanic male who was [REDACTED], with whom I had spoken earlier. The second male matched the description given to me of [REDACTED] father. The last two subjects in the family photograph were two Hispanic females, one approximately in her forties with dark hair and the other approximately 14 to 16 years of age with dark hair. Upon taking notes of the two females in the photograph I saw that they were the two females in the bathtub. I pronounced the two females in the bathroom deceased at 1652 hours on 02/02/18.

The secondary search was then completed, finding no other persons inside the residence. After searching the interior I then assisted in conducting a search of the immediate area around the property. The property was approximately two to three acres in size. At the northwest end of the property I noted a male wearing blue jeans and a dark colored T-shirt lying facedown in a ditch. He was facing away from me on the ground to the north. I approached and provided security while verbal commands were given to him, which he was not complying. Upon approach and while verbal commands were being given I noted a rise and fall in his torso consistent with breathing. I continued to provide lethal cover while Sergeant Tyra deployed his taser and Deputy Starr placed the male into handcuffs. Shortly after I stood by as medical personnel responded to assess the male.

I noted the male had blood on his head, his shirt had various tears, and his hands were completely red and covered with blood. Upon the male being turned over I got a good look at his face and noted that he matched the description given to me by [REDACTED] of his father, as well as the male in the photograph inside the residence. He was Hispanic with straight dark hair, approximately 5'05" to 5'07" tall, and had a slim build. I then attempted to ascertain the identities of the two females found in the bathroom. I conducted a records check of the white Nissan Frontier on the property bearing Arizona license plate 311PPT. It returned to two registered owner, Sandra and Hernando Enriquez. I conducted a records check of Sandra's driver's license of D03890336 and upon viewing her Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) photograph saw that she was one of the

subjects inside the bathtub. I was unable to find the identity of the younger female through any avenue.

I then stood by as scene security until detectives arrived. Upon their arrival I provided them with a briefing of the information I was provided with by Hernando and my findings at the incident location. I continued to stand by as scene security until I was advised that my assistance was no longer required. This concludes my involvement.

The taser had Serial #X290046EC. The taser was deployed from approximately ten feet away with both probes into the back region to include the mid to upper back and the lower back region. It was my understanding that the probes were not removed by me nor anyone at the scene. Also, after the suspect was detained in handcuffs, I physically removed the cartridge and dropped it on the ground so I did not have an active cartridge or have the wires entangled while I was separating myself from the suspect. The deployment cycle was a single trigger pull cycle for a single cartridge. I did not believe that I initiated the arc switch button. At this time, I do not have the serial number for the cartridge that was utilized and recovered as an evidentiary item by the investigating detectives.

NARRATIVE:

On 02/02/18, at approximately 1603 hours, I noted a call that was dispatched at the area of *****
call. The initial information given was a teenage boy had arrived at a neighbor's house bloody with obvious trauma. He was stating to the effect that his father had hit him with a hammer and was trying to kill him. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The initial information given was similar to a

domestic violence call. Two units responded to include Deputy B. S. Starr #8368 and Deputy C. P. Campbell #8344.

At the time, I was assisting on a missing person call reference an elderly male with Alzheimer's disease. I was in and around the area of Tanque Verde Road and Tanque Verde Loop. Based on the information that was given on the call, I decided to attach myself to the assault with a deadly weapon call at approximately 1612 hours. Just prior to that, I also advised Deputy R. M. Taskila #7132 to respond to the call. It was my understanding that Deputy Taskila was responding from the area of Swan Road and Sunrise Drive.

Shortly after attaching myself to the call, I advised Deputy Campbell to retrieve information from the victim prior to him being transported, specifically if there were any other individuals at the house and what sort of weapons the father had in the house itself. Less than ten minutes later, I received a call from Deputy Campbell. He began to advise me on information he had gleaned from speaking with the victim, a teenage male by the name of [REDACTED]

Deputy Campbell stated [REDACTED] had told him that his father had requested him to leave school early in the day. Shortly thereafter when [REDACTED] arrived at the house, he had asked his father where his mother and sister were. Deputy Campbell stated [REDACTED] made a statement that his father had said the mother and sister were playing hide and seek and could not be found or something to that effect.

When Deputy Campbell advised me of this specific information, based upon the statements made and the ominous language which had been used by the father, specifically the hide and seek reference, it was my belief that the father had either harmed the mother and sister or intended to harm the mother and sister to include possibly trying to kill them. At that point, I advised Communications that I would responding with an expedited response. I also requested that Deputy Taskila initiate an expedited response. I informed Communications that, based on a conversation I had with Deputy Campbell, it was my belief that there were potentially additional victims at the house. I requested a second paramedic unit respond and stand off near the location.

At approximately 1634 hours, I arrived at the neighbor's address. At that point, I received a quick briefing from Deputy Starr and Deputy Campbell regarding where the father's residence was located. Deputy Campbell pointed with his finger showing me a house which was adjacent and down the street from where we were currently located.

Shortly thereafter, I put out a brief on the radio to Deputy Taskila informing him that, when he arrived, our intentions were to move up on the house which was the house at ***** announcements. If we did not receive a response, or even if we had received a response, but based on the circumstances surrounding the call itself, my intention was to physically breach the front door and make entry into the location based on the emergency entry exception to having a warrant.

I was basing my decision upon the fact that we had a teenage male who had arrived a neighbor's house pleading for help who was quite obviously severely injured stating he had been injured by his father. Also, the statements that the teenage male, [REDACTED] had made stating that his father was trying to kill him [REDACTED] and also the statements that his father had made regarding [REDACTED] mother and sister that they were playing hide and seek and could not be found. Based on the totality of those circumstances, it was my belief that the mother and sister were in grave jeopardy and an emergency entry response was warranted at the [REDACTED] address.

At approximately 1644 hours, Deputy Taskila, Deputy Starr, Deputy Campbell and I arrived at the location. I had retrieved breaching gear from my patrol vehicle to include a small battering ram and a small halligan. I also staged a sledgehammer on the passenger's side of my vehicle. I had received basic breaching training through my years with the Pima Regional Special Weapons and Tactics team. I decided that, based on my training and experience, it would be most beneficial if I conducted the breach rather than having the additional deputies conduct the breach without any formalized training.

Upon arrival, I made loud knock and announcements on the front door identifying myself as being part of the Sheriff's Department and requiring that any individual in the house open the door. After a brief period of time without any response, I conducted a physical breach on the front door utilizing the battering ram. The door subsequently gave way through the force of the ram.

At which point, I took note of the interior portion of the residence. There was significant blood that had been deposited on the floor, as well as the walls. There looked to be indications that a struggle had taken place in the interior house itself with a number of items on the floor. There was also a large defect in the wall which resembled a human body being thrown or pushed against the wall.

I gave secondary announcements at the front door, as well as Deputy Taskila also gave secondary announcements. Again, we received no response. Shortly

thereafter, at approximately 1647 hours, we made entry into the location at

Starr and I physically occupied and cleared what was believed to be the master bedroom. There was also an adjacent bathroom that was part of the master bedroom. That bathroom had a secondary door which led out into the kitchen area. Again, there was significant blood on the floor, on the walls and on the counters as we made entry and physically cleared the rooms.

I communicated with Deputy Taskila and Deputy Campbell that we were coming out from the bathroom into the kitchen area where again there was significant blood on the floor. At which point, we physically cleared the kitchen area and then met back up with Deputy Taskila and Deputy Campbell who had been holding for the remainder portion of the house.

At that point, all four of us began to make our way toward the remainder of the house that had yet to be cleared. There was a living room area and off to the left there were two bedrooms and a bathroom. The nearest-most bedroom door was open exposing the room; however, the bathroom which was in the middle of the two bedrooms, had the door closed and the furthest-most bedroom door was closed. Two deputies entered the open bedroom door and cleared that while Deputy Campbell and I remained holding on the bathroom and other bedroom door.

After they had cleared the house, I advised deputies to pop the door on the bathroom. The door on the bathroom was opened and, at that point, we discovered the two female bodies of both the mother and sister. Their names were Sandra Enriquez, the mother, and Isabel Enriquez, the sister/daughter. Both females were lying in the bathtub and appeared to be [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Both females had sustained severe trauma from what appeared to be a [REDACTED]. There was absolute and severe trauma to both bodies which indicated they were, in fact, deceased. However, I did have Deputy Starr and Deputy Campbell confirm that they were, in fact, deceased.

At that point, we focused on the remaining bedroom. Shortly thereafter, I popped the door on the remaining bedroom. We had not found the father and/or suspect at that point. We slowly cleared the last bedroom which I believed belonged to the sister, Isabel.

At that point, we had conducted a primary search of the residence. I assigned Deputy Starr and Deputy Campbell to conduct a secondary search of the residence. At which point, Deputy Taskila and I posted on the porch area due to the fact that the suspect was still at large. Shortly thereafter, I began formulating a tactical plan for the remaining property. When Deputy Starr and Deputy Campbell were finished with the secondary search, which was at approximately 1657 hours,

I briefed them on the tactical plan regarding the remaining property. The property included vehicles, a horse trailer, some sheds and additional horse corrals.

At approximately 1658 hours, we made our way out onto the property line. We cleared visually as much as we could with regards to the roof due to the fact that there was a ladder going to the room. We then made our way toward the vehicles. I assisted in clearing a full size pickup truck that was parked in the front of the residence, as well as a horse trailer which was adjacent to it. We then also cleared underneath the porch visually as best as possible.

Shortly thereafter, the four of us made our way to the backyard area and began physically clearing that area. While moving our way west and clearing sheds et cetera, at approximately 1705 hours, Deputy Campbell noted a male subject lying in a culvert/ditch that was off to our right approximately 15 yards. At that point, I readjusted my focus on that subject. The subject matched the description of the father, as well as the pictures we had noted of the father inside of the house. It should also be noted that the subject lying in the ditch was completely covered in blood. It was undetermined at that point whether or not it was his blood or blood from the interior of the residence, specifically the two female bodies that we had discovered in the bathtub.

I began to give commands to the subject. Prior to giving commands, I noted the subject was still breathing. I could specifically note the rise and fall of his stomach. Because of the way his T-shirt was laying, I could see his skin and see quite clearly that he was, in fact, breathing. I had advised over the radio that we had located the subject and he was breathing. I also advised deputies that I noted he was, in fact, breathing.

I continued to give commands to the subject; however, he did not respond to the commands given. At that point, I began to close the distance on the subject. When I arrived adjacent to him within approximately ten feet away, I informed the other deputies to prepare to go hands on with the subject. At that point, I removed my X2 taser and put a single cartridge on the back portion of the subject whom we believed at that point was, in fact, our suspect. The conducted electrical weapon, or taser, did perform with the desired effect that I was seeking. The suspect appeared to lock up and began to display the neuromuscular incapacitation which was unique to the Taser X2 system.

My rationale or justification for utilizing the taser at that point was the suspect was lying on his stomach with both hands concealed underneath his torso. We had given him multiple commands and he was not responding. We could see that he was, in fact, still breathing. We had made note of the double homicide that

had taken place within the residential structure, as well as the information that had been given by the son that the father had, in fact, attempted to kill him. At that point, based on the information that we had, not knowing what potential weapons the suspect held underneath his torso, it was my decision to utilize a level of force with the taser and attempt to incapacitate the suspect temporarily to where we could move up and place handcuffs on him during that phase.

Both probes landed in the mid and lower back region. The suspect did look as though he physically locked up and he did make a grunting or groaning sound; however, nothing additional at that point. I informed Deputy Starr to move up at that point and place handcuffs on the individual. Deputy Starr did so. At which point, I then advised Communications that we had detained one believing him to be our suspect, Hernando Enriquez, Sr., and requested the paramedic unit which had been standing by down the street move in to administer first aid to the suspect.

Shortly thereafter, my remaining responsibilities were to ensure that the crime scene was secure and awaiting arrival of detectives. I coordinated that effort with Captain J. O. Lopez #755, who was the Force Commander, who had also arrived on the scene just prior to us locating the suspect. I then made advisories to include a phone call to Lieutenant J. H. Copfer #1052 who was the Rincon District commander.

I remained at the scene until approximately 0100 hours. I also at one point, per the request of Sergeant J. M. Isely #1044, conducted a walk through with the primary investigative detective and Identification Technician just to show them where we had cleared, what we had seen, et cetera.

I did conduct a brief tactical debrief with the primary elements above to include Deputy Taskila, Deputy Starr and Deputy Campbell. I also recommended that peer support be utilized by those individuals if need be based on the severity of the crime scene.

This concludes my involvement in this case.



I then stood by with the overall briefing by Deputy C. P. Campbell #8344 and then assisted Detective C. J. Hogan #1233 in obtaining a search warrant by calling Judge Butler. I kept the recording and put that into verbatim so it could be transcribed.

I then assisted in placarding the property. We started outside with the vehicles, placard the porch and then the individual rooms. While placarding the rooms, some detail photographs were done without moving anything. Leica was also done inside.

After that was done, I assisted in searching items and collecting items. After assisting collecting several items, I then left the scene having no further involvement. I did not interview anybody and did not do any of the surrounding areas on knocking and talking to neighbors.

Narrative:

On 02/02/2018 at about 1720 hrs I was contacted by Sergeant Rosalik #4912 and asked to become involved in this investigation. I was told the incident involved a double homicide with one injured person and the suspect was unresponsive with what appeared to be self-inflicted injuries. I was told the scene was at *****
to respond at 1750 hrs and arrived at 1810 hrs.

On arrival I learned that the scene was actually at *****
The parcel is located at the southern end of [REDACTED]
intersects with an easement road. That easement road [REDACTED]
into *****
with the home being [REDACTED] The front door [REDACTED]
There are [REDACTED] The home is [REDACTED]

After detectives had arrived we received a briefing from the deputies on

scene. This included the initial response to the Calle Agassiz location reference an aggravated assault. On arrival to that location contact was made with the victim who directed deputies to his residence. When they arrived there forced entry was made into the home where two deceased bodies were found in a bathroom. When the rest of the property was cleared a third person was found in a ditch area by the corrals. This person was detained and ultimately transported to University Medical Center (UMC). The subject from the initial contact was also transported to UMC.

Detective Siress #7341 and I were assigned to respond to the Agassiz location and interview the homeowner. We responded to that location to find the property located on the west side of an easement that ran north from the paved portion of Calle Agassiz. This easement was about 150-200 yards east of the intersection with Calle Rinconado. The property was identified by numbers that were attached and once attached to the fencing. The residence is a manufactured home that is on a northwest to southeast axis with the front door facing an eastern direction. The front door has a porched area that is partially enclosed by wood fencing. There is also a porch on the west side of the home that is not enclosed.

As Det. Siress and I began to ascend the east side porch I noted spatter on the floor of the porch that appeared to be from the painting of the fencing. As we neared the door I saw a blood spot that was on the floor about two feet from the door. I also noted blood on the wrought iron door. The home owner contacted us from the west side of the home. He indicated that the east side doors were not functioning properly and he used the west as the main point of ingress/egress. He directed us to the interior where he was interviewed.

The subject identified himself to us as James Talbot. He was interviewed from 1***** hrs. In the interview he detailed how he was made aware of the incident. He told us how he directed the victim to the west porch and that he called 911 prior to meeting him there. When he met with the victim James described the injuries he had seen and the statements made to him from the victim. He went on to say that he had taken a towel from the house and used it to put on the victim's head. He later directed us to that towel. James also told us that there was some medical waste that was left by paramedics that he had discarded. For further details refer to Det. Siress' supplemental report as well as the audio recording.

At 1945 hrs Det. Siress and I returned to Talbot's residence where we collected swabs of the blood from the floor and the wrought iron screen door on the east porch. We also collected swabs of blood from a chair on the west porch as well as the towel James had previously described using. Photographs were

taken noting the residence and the collection of the evidence.

While waiting for the service of the search warrant to begin I was informed of some people who had arrived in the area of the home. A request had been made for law enforcement to meet with them. I responded to that location and contacted them. They identified themselves as Carol Whittaker and Robert Williams. They identified themselves as family friends knowing the family through church at the Tucson Baptist Temple and also the wife had done work cleaning stalls for Carol. Carol also said that she knew of the wife's family and may have contact information for them. She went on to say that the husband worked at Raytheon. Carol gave a contact number of ***** identifying it as a land line. As I was speaking with her Detective Johnson #5797 arranged for the care of the animals on the property. For further details of that refer to Det. Johnson's supplemental report.

I then helped in the processing of the scene by the corral. It had been identified by an alphanumeric placard of "T". We stood by as the scene was scanned by the Leica scanner. When that was completed we began our processing. This included the measuring of the locations of the evidence and the collection of the evidence. There were three physical items that were noted and swabs of an area of blood. On the west side of the corral area was a covered area. There were four pillars that supported the roof. I used the two pillars on the west as permanent points to take measurements. Permanent point (PPT) A was the northern pillar and permanent point B was the southern pillar. I was able to respond at approximately 1751 hours and arrived on scene at 1811 hours. I noted the residence was a mobile home with a fixed front porch and the front door facing to the east. The mobile home was beige in color and on the west side of the residence there were horse corrals and exercise pins. Upon arrival I made contact with Sgt. J. Isely #1044 and once other responding detectives arrived we were briefed on the incident by Deputy C. Campbell #8344.

Deputy Campbell stated deputies were dispatched to an assault with a deadly weapon, were a male contacted 911 with injuries. Deputies made contact with [REDACTED] who had run to a neighbor's residence stating he had been attacked by his father also known as Hernando Enriquez. Deputy Campbell advised once the son was being evaluated by medical personnel, the deputies responded to the incident location and had to force entry into the residence. The bodies of two deceased females were discovered in a bathroom located on the southeast side of the residence with substantial trauma to them. Deputy Campbell advised they made contact with a male outside past the covered horse corral lying face down in a small wash area. Commands were given and the male was detained by the deputies. The male later identified as Hernando V. Enriquez the father of [REDACTED] and Isabel and husband to Sandra. Deputy Campbell stated Hernando Senior had wounds to his chest and abdominal area, once moved from his location a knife was located where he was laying and left for collection by detectives at a later time. Deputy Campbell stated he had collected Hernando Seniors pants and wallet from the medical personnel who had treated him. I took custody of these items at 1852 hours. Later I processed the pants by taking photographs and wrapping them between a large sheets of brown paper, the wallet was photographed along with its contents. The SIMS card was sent to forensics for download.

Once the briefing was complete, Sergeant Isely requested for Detective J. Petersen #7730 and I to canvas the area. We made contact at two residences and I left a business card at another. The properties consist of one to two acres with surrounding fence and gates.

Judy & Dory Guill - *****

Judy stated she moved in about five years ago along with her daughter Dory. Judy stated she just saw Sandra and Isabel the day before on February 01, 2018. Judy stated Sandra would come over every few days with her canine Stella and they would talk. On February 1st, Sandra stated to Judy she had just had a doctor's appointment earlier in the day. Sandra stated she had been having some pain and was diagnosed with a large cyst in the ovarian area, Sandra stated she was a having pain and preferred to stand when she was talking to Judy. I asked Judy if she knew if the family had any domestic issues, which she stated she did not believe so. Judy described the family as very religious and went to a Baptist Church in town. Judy stated the father who she referred to as Vald mostly kept to himself but at times would come over if she needed help with her vehicle, mostly doing neighborly stuff. Judy stated Sandra and Vald were from Ecuador and Vald works at Raytheon Monday - Friday from 1400 to midnight. Judy stated Vald also was attending Pima Community College but knew that he had taken this semester off. Judy stated the children had been home schooled except [REDACTED] the son was to graduate from Vail Academy in May. Judy stated Sandra's parents reside in New Jersey and described the entire family as sweet people. Judy stated there were two canines in the residence who she identified as Stella and Tinker. Dory did not have anything further to add.

Robert & Shirley Leftwich - *****
Robert stated he and his mother were working out in the front yard around 1030 or 1100 AM. Robert stated he thought he saw Sandra walking south between his property and the property to the east. Shirley stated she thought it was the daughter Isabel both stated male was walking with the female. Both continued south to a concrete pad just south of the main road and where there for about a half hour. Robert and Shirley were not sure if the male was the son or father and described the family as quiet, Vald worked in the afternoons and Sandra was a fitness coach and was friendly in nature. Robert stated it had been awhile since he had any contact with the Enriquez family.

Business card was left at *****

While walking back to the incident location I made contact with Detective S. George #1101 who was speaking with a male and female identified as Carol Whittaker and Robert Williams. Carol and Robert were friends of the Enriquez and when asked if they had any information on Sandra's parents, Carol stated she did but it was at her residence. Carol was concerned for the animals, I asked Carol if she would care for Tinker who was currently in the backyard and she stated she would. I was able to escort Tinker to Carol and asked her to call me when she had the parent information. Carol also agreed to care for the horses on the property along with the other animals. Carol also stated there was a feline in the residence. A short time later Carol called with Sandra's parents information

which was provided to Sergeant Isely. It should be noted I was in contact with Carol throughout the weekend regarding the care of the animals.

Detective George and I were tasked with processing horse corral area where Hernando Enriquez was originally located. Detective George and I worked as search team, I collected the evidence while he provided the evidence envelopes and sealed them once the items were collected. The shirt was still wet from blood therefore it was not sealed and placed in the drying room by Detective C. Hogan #1233. Detective George and I took measurements prior to removing any evidentiary items.

Note: The Leica scanner was used to scan the crime scene to include the horse corral area and the interior of the residence.

I assisted inside of the residence by completing evidence packaging and providing it to detectives who collected the evidence, once collected the packaging was sealed with evidence tape and signed with my initials, badge and date. Items which were wet were not sealed and provided to detectives who placed the evidence items into the drying rooms located at the Pima County Forensic Building after the search warrant was complete.

Once completed I was no longer needed and exited the residence, completing my assignment at the incident location with no further involvement.

On 02.05.18 at approximately 0930 hours I assisted Detective J. Banuelos #6861 and Detective J. Davila #1269 in the drying room. The only item which was dry was UMCSC - Blue Hanes Underwear. This item was collected and placed into evidence at the Pima County Evidence Building.
